

**Trustee** – Bob Edmunds gave the report. The alarm system was checked in July.


The Eternal Flame is very expensive to operate. Kathy is researching new options.

## CHRIST'S "SPIRITUAL FIRST RESPONDERS!" LUTHERAN CENTER FOR RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

Have this in mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though He was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Philippians 2:5-8

St Paul here tells us to "have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus." That do you think he means by that? Well, let's unpack the mind of Christ, shall we? Jesus is faithful to the Word of God, the words of the Bible, in thought and deed. He is holy and lived a holy life in all things to honor the Father who sent Him into the world. He lived a life of obedience that not only continues to teach and speak about love, but also put suck love into action. And here's the kicker. He has the mindset that leads to purposeful action, NOT for himself, but for others.

I've been using a metaphor of what that mindset might look like in my teaching and my writing for the last year. It paints the picture of what a disciple of Jesus might be like, one who puts all of his/her stature, status and wisdom to work, but NOT for themselves. I think the image of that kind of disciple of Jesus would look like a "first responder" of grace, a "spiritual first responder" in the lives of the people whom God sends our way.

Just think about what first responders are and do. They are people who have been well trained and are well versed in the things that matter in their vocations. They are to be faithful to that training and willing to execute it at a moment's notice whenever it is needed. Yet here's the thing that makes first responders unique. They are to put all that wisdom, training and expertise to work, NOT FOR THEIR OWN GAIN, but to rescue others. I can't think of a better analogy for what it means to be a disciple of Jesus than to be a "spiritual first responder." It means to be equipped with God's Word and the power of His Spirit, to become well versed in the challenges that are in this world and then being willing to engage them as we put all that to work for the sake of others.

Can you imagine if people thought of us as well trained, biblical thinkers, who strive for holiness and excellence in all we do and also realize that WE STAND READY TO PUT ALL THAT TO USE, NOT FOR OUR OWN GAIN, BUT TO MEET THE NEEDS OF OTHERS, FOR THEIR LIVES AND EVEN SALVATION? Can you imagine if that became the image of Christians in the minds of others?

There's a reason that we respect firefighters, police officers and military personnel. They run into the fire, the battle or the fight when most everyone else is running away. They do it for the sake of others. That's a mindset we all need, especially as we try to speak God's truth in love to others (Ephesians 4:15). By God's grace, it's a mindset that we can have and put to good use right now. Our world needs God's people ready to engage in that kind of service now more than ever.

PRAYER: Dear Lord Jesus, continue to amaze us about all that You have done for us and let that amazing joy empower our service to others with a first responder mindset! AMEN.



## Stewards of Sacred Time



n last month's StewardCAST there was a call for faithful stewards to start to live as "exiled stewards." This means those who are created and redeemed to be stewards actively embrace the idea that the world in which the steward lives is not an ultimate destination. The steward labors in a world that looks and feels far more like Babylon than the Promised Land. But this is where the

Lord has placed His stewards. Using created things, the steward is to reflect the love of the Creator within the fallen world. This is done by using created things to point the fallen world to the only thing worth stewarding: the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The Christian steward is a steward of a community within a community. The church is a little bit of Eden placed within the realm of the fallen world.

"Exiled stewardship" in the church calls for our community-within-a-community to be both distinct from and engaged in the world. We are distinct because our community is defined by the Lord. Like the tabernacle was at the center of the community that was ancient Israel, so the altar is a defining centrality to our exiled steward community. It sets us apart. It absolves us. It nourishes us. It sends us to live the different kind of life for which the exile steward has been formed and redeemed. Because of what this community of exile stewards sees, hears, tastes, touches and smells from and around the altar, we are different.

## Putting away the "T's" of stewardship

It is this difference that calls us to a unique stewardship of sacred time. This stewardship of sacred time is different than the tired expression of stewardship of time that has been taught in decades past. In fact, it really is TIME for us to put away the old "T's" of stewardship. They are not helpful in the least since they lead to a compartmentalization of stewardship that is just not present in the Scripture. The steward manages all of life and life's resources for God's glory. But this management is holistic, not piecemeal. There is no partial faithfulness in the steward. The steward doesn't get partial credit. The standard is pass/fail. We are faithful in all things, or we are unfaithful. To sanctify the work of author Jim Collins, "good is the enemy of [faithful]" when it comes to stewardship.

In Scripture there are two different words for time. Each carries a different connotation. One of the concepts is the one that we normally think of when we hear the word "time." The linear nature of time slipping, slipping, slipping into the future is indeed one of those concepts. The word for this sort of time in Greek is *chronos*. Chronological time is indeed an element that the faithful steward is called to handle as a trust from God. Time cannot be saved. It runs through our fingers like water. We can manage time more or less faithfully, but it cannot be stored or restored.

Because of this, faithful stewards entrusted with minutes, hours and days do need to be intentional about their stewardship of this fleeting trust from the Lord. Every moment of chronological time is a matter of stewardship of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

## Stewarding two types of time

But there is a second concept of time. The word for it in Greek is *kairos*. This is the sacred time that the steward is really all about. *Kairos* is not measured by clocks or calendars. *Kairos* is more about the *right* time rather than the quantity of time. It is the stewardship of *kairos* time that leads

to our stewardship of *chronos* time. When the steward's days and weeks are anchored in sacred time — with set times in the day for the Word and prayer and set times for being gathered by the Holy Spirit for Word and Sacrament with the body of Christ in the Divine Service — then it is possible to be faithful in chronological time. Stewardship of sacred time establishes faithfulness in stewardship of all time.

Stewardship of *kairos* time reveals truths about the steward. There is an old adage that goes "show me your calendar and I will show you your god." Does your chronological stewardship of time have fluid or infrequent moments with the Lord in worship, at the Table and in prayer? This betrays a stewardship that is defined by other gods. When our stewardship of *chronos* time — work time or play time, leisure time or kids' game times — smothers our stewardship of *kairos* time, it reveals not a time problem but a First Commandment problem. Seeking the Sabbath rest our

Lord created us for and calls us to in Holy Baptism calls for our *kairos* time to be the guide in our stewardship

of all time.

Let it be a call to repent. After all, repentance is the way of life for a Christian steward! Stewardship of sacred time is not about how much time is being spent in service to the Gospel. It is about spending the right times in stewardship of the Gospel. The steward cannot manage what they don't have. A steward not sitting at the feet of the Master runs the risk of running dry. But when faithful with kairos time — Word time, Sacrament time, Gospel time — then

it is the Lord who fills the *chronos* time in life with grace shown in mercy and love to the neighbor.


