

<u>Meeting was called to order</u> by President Pete Pettit at 6:02 pm. Tim opened with prayer.

Approval of minutes: The minutes of the May 8, 2025 Council Meeting were read. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as read. Motion was approved by voice vote.

Council Reports:

President's report (Pete Pettit): No Report

Vice-President's report (Leroy Peterson): Constitution and Bylaws update:

Janis provided written Evangelism comments and recommendations to the proposed Constitution and Bylaws. Kathy has no Treasurer or Finance comments or recommendations. Bill commented that the Elders prefer a change to selection of elders from vote by congregation, to selection by Elders and Pastor, and requested Leroy work out the correct language to effect this recommendation. Jan provided written Preschool comments and recommendations. Kay requested all language referencing a church bus be removed from the Human Care sections, but acknowledged this is not a critical change since we don't currently own a bus.

Leroy will update the Constitution and Bylaws document with all submitted recommendations and then schedule another Constitution Committee meeting to finalize the draft.

Board of Elders report (Bill Hermann):

The elders have made assignment of all new members to an elder. The elders will post a list of elders with their assigned persons so all can be aware of their placements. Jason has been unable to be in active participation, so his assignments will be placed with other elders.

The pipe organ dedication will be Saturday evening, August 30. This is planned to be a music celebration of multiple musical instruments, not only the organ.

Pastor has proposed that New Member Sundays and baptisms occur on the last Sunday of the month to simplify scheduling.

The annual church picnic is scheduled for July 20 at 3:00 pm.

The Trump family will be visiting on June 15, with a salmon bake pot-luck fellowship after worship.

Member boxes in the narthex need updating.

The next elders meeting will be on July 10, 5:00 pm, instead of the regular meeting date of July 3.

Trustee's report (Kathy Smith for Dan Smith):

The new bookcases have arrived.

The solar window film has been applied at the south side of the sanctuary and narthex, and appears to already be having a positive effect. Remaining windows will be treated as time allows.

The choir chairs in the little chapel have been bolted down for safety.

St. Matthew Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes, June 12, 2025 (Follow-up actions are italicized)

Youth & Education report (Tim Roberton):

Tuesday Bible study and fellowship continues to go well. There has been a drop in attendance due to summer activities but this event will continue.

Sunday School:

Pastor Peder is planning to kick off Sunday School in August or September. Tim recommends a minimum of at least two adults at all times for accountability, so additional volunteers may be recruited.

Peggy commented that Holy Trinity has a similar Sunday School program to what we are planning and it has been successful. This could also benefit preschool recruitment.

Janis suggested that Sunday School during worship could help promote family attendance and provide benefits to both children and their parents. Tim stated that this was considered but an after-worship schedule has been settled on for now.

Fellowship (Peggy Romero): Additional hosts for the Sunday coffee hour are needed. Peggy will help anyone who needs or want assistance.

<u>Human Care: (Kay Hermann):</u> Wednesday dinner is going well with about 80 attendees. Kay has submitted for a Haller Grant award, requesting \$14,000. The Wednesday group would like additional cooks.

Treasurer's report (Kathy Smith): Nothing at this time

Evangelism report (Janis Deverter): The Clallam Fair booth spaces have been reserved. Carl and Janis are working to obtain needed supplies and will soon start recruiting volunteers.

Stewardship report (Lynn Vernon): No report

Subcommittee Reports:

Preschool (Jan Edmunds):

Four students are currently enrolled for the next school year. Both teachers will return for next year. The Preschool Board is taking the month of July off.

Our target demographic is stay-at-home families because we don't offer a day care program.

Jan would like to include preschool families in all congregation-wide mailings and emails to encourage them to feel like a part of the church family.

Preschool may consider holding a preschool reunion.

Unfinished Business:

Trump family visit on June 15:

Pastor Trump will lead Bible class and preach during worship, with Pastor Sonnenberg leading all other parts of the worship service. Bill recommended Pastor Trump be paid the full \$200 guest pastor stipend.

There will be free-will offering opportunities at worship and at the salmon bake fellowship time, to support the Trump mission. Janis volunteered to prepare signs for the free-will offering baskets. Kathy will prepare a sheet for the bulletin with free-will offering and online giving information.

Mega sale: Kay reported that a total of \$8,305 was raised. There were plenty of volunteers and the after-sale clean up is complete. Of the total raised, \$1,000 will go to the preschool and the remainder will go to the fellowship hall flooring fund. Kay commented that social media helped publicize and promote the sale. Jan commended and thanked kay for the amazing results from the mega sale. Kay thanked Janis for the beautiful set-up for the boutique area.

St. Matthew Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes, June 12, 2025 (Follow-up actions are italicized)

Unfinished Business: (continued)

The church picnic will be July 20, 3:00-6:00 pm. Hamburgers and hot dogs will be provided and all other dishes will be pot-luck.

New budget:

Kathy reviewed the current treasurer report, and reported that all are keeping expenses under con-

The \$50,000 in savings that belonged to the general fund was erroneously moved to Special Projects and will be moved back to the general fund, reducing the Special Projects fund balance to approximately \$93,000 minus the \$35,000 that was previously approved for the sanctuary flooring. Kathy requested clarification if the congregation needs to be asked to reauthorize the flooring expenditure due to the mistaken balance in the Special Projects fund. Consensus was to inform the congregation of this Special Funds balance reporting error at the June 22 congregational meeting but not require a sanctuary flooring reauthorization.

Kathy provided copies of the proposed new annual budget.

Peggy asked that grief share money be designated. Kathy will take care of this.

Janis recommended that the \$500 designated for St Andrews ministry be moved to Clallam Fair, plus an additional \$500 for the Fair.

A question was raised about why there is a congregational line item for "missions," recommending this should be under Evangelism. Kathy will double check this item.

Kathy will make all recommended changes and have the new annual budget ready for congregational approval on June 22.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the budget as amended, and present to the congregation for approval at the June 22 meeting. Motion was approved by voice vote.

New Business:

A question was raised about safety and supervision of children and youth after worship. Pete will speak with Pastor Sonnenberg.

Fellowship Hall flooring fund: With approximately \$3,000 currently in the flooring fund, plus \$7,305 from the mega sale, the new flooring fund balance is \$10,715. An updated quote for replacing the fellowship hall flooring is \$17,309. A motion was made and seconded to ask the congregation for approval to spend the remainder needed from the Special Projects fund, in order to move this work forward. Motion was approved by voice vote.

Kathy stated the roof cross repair and exterior sign replacement may need to be funded by the Special Projects fund. She presented a sign sample of synthetic material, quoted at \$4,500. An aluminum sign sample and quote is yet to come but is likely to be higher. However, council expressed dissatisfaction with the synthetic sign material, questioning its long-term durability. Topic tabled for now.

Future Business:

Jan requested council permission for a book sale preschool fund-raiser. Consensus was to approve this request.

Leroy requested approval for a t-shirt and sweatshirt preschool fund-raiser. Theme of the shirts is "Luke 2" and is designed to encourage informal conversations with unbelievers about the Christmas story. Orders would be taken for t-shirts and sweatshirts, which would arrive before Christmas. A discount may be available with sufficient quantity of ordered shirts. Consensus was to approve this request.

If you're still unsure, take it to prayer. God will lead you. We need you. The world needs Jesus. Let's do this—together!






Music Concert



BETTER TOGETHER

Let no one seek his own good, but the good of his neighbor. I Corinthians 10:24

In the book of Luke, a man asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" How do we answer that question today for ourselves? We have many neighbors don't we? We know every human was knit together by God as a gift with gifts to share. God invites us to bring those gifts together, to use them collectively to pursue the common good right where He has placed us, in our own neighborhoods.

Better Together is a Lutheran Hour Ministries resource to help you and /or your congregation share the Gospel in word and deed in your community and neighborhood. Better Together comes in kit form, boxed with the following inside: The Hopeful Neighborhood book is an excellent Scripture based study for small groups. The Field Guide leads individuals or groups through 6 sessions on pursuing the common good of their neighborhood, with engaging online videos available through hopefulneighborhood.org/. The kit introduces 2 Project Connect booklets (Everyone is a Gift and Love Thy Neighborhood), to explore how we are all called to relate to our neighbors. Two children's booklets (I Love My Neighborhood! and Precious in His Sight) share the same lessons in rhyming verse so kids can learn the same principles. There is even a Neighborhood Bingo game included to help engage and challenge our neighbors!
