



Meeting was called to order by President Pete Pettit at 6:03 pm. Pastor Sonnenberg opened with prayer.

Approval of minutes: The minutes of the September 11, 2025 Council Meeting were read. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as read. Motion was approved by voice vote.

Pastor's Report: No report

Council Reports:

President's report (Pete Pettit): No report

<u>Vice-President's report (Leroy Peterson):</u> Luke 2 preschool fund raiser. Leroy has received orders for 38 or 39 t-shirts and sweatshirts, but 50 were needed to receive the discount. However, Messiah Lutheran Church in Grand Junction, Colorado, has offered for us to combine our order with theirs in order to receive the discount. Further, a member of Messiah has volunteered to pay for the entirety of our order in the amount of \$1,296, as a generous gesture of support of our preschool program. Pastor recommended a letter of thanks be written in grateful recognition of this donation.

Board of Elders (Bill Hermann):

A poster with elder names and photos remains in progress.

Octoberfest will be on Friday, October 24. The preschool is hosting and will receive free-will offerings from this event.

A question has been received if a person can be a member at St Matthew without being baptized. Pastor affirmed this is possible.

Leroy has agreed to serve as head usher.

Worship services without communion will be held on Thanksgiving Eve, Wednesday, November 26.

There will be four persons baptized on Sunday, October 19.

The church secretary's workload has become excessive for the number of hours Kathy is authorized to work. The elders are authorizing and encouraging Kathy to say "No" as necessary to additional work and service requests.

Bob Edmunds has requested to serve as ad hoc IT advisor, without being elected as the official Council IT chairperson.

St. Matthew Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes, October 9, 2025

(Follow-up actions are italicized)

Trustee (Dan Smith):

A new exterior sign will be installed in approximately four weeks. The new sign will be similar in design to the existing worn and weathered sign.

The 118 rental house recently received a housing authority inspection. Two items were found to require attention: five new GFI outlets, and upgraded smoke detectors.

New hard flooring will be installed in the sanctuary beginning Monday, October 13.

Leroy is installing a new shelf in the wiggle room for a sanctuary speaker.

Youth & Education (Kathy reporting for Tim Roberton):

Additional Sunday School volunteers are needed.

Tim will pause regular game nights for now, electing instead to organize individual special events.

Fellowship (Peggy Romero): No report

Human Care (Kay Hermann): Fire department CPR training is being checked on.

Treasurer (Kathy Smith):

Kathy handed out graph reports of Income and Expenses, restricted fund balances, and average Sunday attendance and giving; also the first quarter Budget Update report.

The new sanctuary flooring expense will be paid from Special Projects Fund, and the new exterior sign will be paid from the Trustees budget.

If January 1 salary adjustments are chosen to be made, a budget amendment will need to be approved by the congregation. The only required salary adjustment will be to accommodate the upcoming Washington State minimum wage increase. Kathy is recommending all salary adjustments except the minimum wage requirement be postponed to the start of the new fiscal year, July 1, 2026. *The elders will discuss and decide*. It was questioned if any other budget adjustments might be required on January 1, but Kathy replied that other new year increases have already been planned for in the existing budget.

Evangelism (Carl and Janis Deverter): No report

Stewardship (Lynn Vernon):

The next new member dinner will be the first week of November, with approximately seven or eight persons expected.

Lynn continues to call and write encouraging notes to guests and inactive members. Teresa has given Lynn a box of beautiful cards for this purpose.

Subcommittee Reports:

Preschool (Jan Edmunds):

The Trunk or Treat event is pending additional volunteers. We need a minimum of eight cars to move forward.

A CPR class is scheduled on November 3, requiring a minimum of five persons at a cost of \$70 per person.

St. Matthew Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes, October 9, 2025

Unfinished Business:

There is a concern about the stability of the new grey chairs in the fellowship hall.

Property insurance inspection recommendations:

We are awaiting estimates for parking lot pavement repairs.

Mike is working on installing a needed stairway handrail.

Pete will contact someone about the roof moss remediation.

It was found that the AED batteries are fine, but the pads are expired. The CPR class instructor may beasked to look at this.

The golf course will not approve the addition of "In Honor of Steven Schlaffman" to our existing sponsorship sign. Other alternatives might be to place this on a bench or picnic table at the golf course. Information and pricing from the golf course is still pending.

New Business:

We are having microphone issues in the sanctuary. Jan recommended developing a long range audio-visual plan, with special consideration to those with hearing issues. *Pete will speak with Bob about possible options*.

Bible verse cards are being added to the Wednesday dinner to-go boxes as a spiritual encouragement to the recipients.

Future Business: None

Daily Devotions from Lutheran Hour Ministries By Pastor Ken Klaus, Speaker Emeritus of The Lutheran Hour "Weighing the Children"

He established a testimony in Jacob and appointed a law in Israel, which He commanded our fathers to teach to their children, that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children, so that they should set their hope in God and not forget the works of God, but keep His commandments.

Psalm 78:5-7

Glen Adsit was a missionary to China. Accompanied by his family, Adsit tried to share the Savior's story of salvation as quietly and secretly as was possible. Apparently, he was not quiet or secretive enough. Adsit was caught and he, along with his family, were placed under house arrest. After some time, soldiers told him he was being deported. They also informed him he could take 200 pounds of stuff. But how do you pick 200 pounds of stuff? For years they had been in China and during that time they had collected precious things, things connected with memories. How to decide what would be left behind? Everything precious was sorted and weighed and then sorted again. Eventually, they managed to reduce the pile of stuff to 200 pounds. Adsit and his family were ready when the soldiers arrived.

"Are you prepared to leave?" the soldiers asked. "Yes." "Have you weighed everything?" an officer wanted to know. "Yes." "Did you weigh the children?" Weigh the children? Of course, they hadn't weighed the children!

For Adsit and his wife, the children had been a given -- the children had been taken for granted. In a split second, the officer's question realigned everything. The new typewriter, the valuable vase, the precious picture instantly became trash and were set aside. Bringing their children with them, making sure the children were safe, became the parents' single priority: their chief concern.

Fathers, today I'm asking, have you weighed the children?

Now I know you have many things which weigh on your mind, which call for your attention, which must be accomplished before the sun sets. But the question is "Have you weighed the children?" The truth is, everything else on your calendar, every goal you have set for yourself, pales in comparison to your God-given duties

- 1. to share the Savior's story of salvation with your little ones;
- 2. to set an example of how a Christian should conduct himself in an unchristian world.

Now you may be blessed to have a Christian wife, a pastor who is a most remarkable man for the Lord, and your church may be equipped with a multitude of dedicated teachers determined to do all they can to shape your little ones.

But the truth is this: the Lord has placed into your children a desire to emulate you, respect you, be like you. You can't stop it; you can't prevent it. And they will follow a good example or a bad example. In words and living, it is my hope and prayer that you point them to Jesus who gave His life, so they might be forgiven, so they might be saved, so they might spend an eternity in heaven with their heavenly and earthly fathers.

THE PRAYER: Dear Lord, for fathers who have followed the Savior and shown how Jesus can live in the heart and actions of a man, I give thanks. Raise up many more examples. In Jesus' Name, I ask it. Amen.
