



**Meeting was called to order** by President Pete Pettit at 6:01 pm. Tim opened with prayer.

**Approval of minutes:** : The minutes of the March 13, 2025 Council Meeting were read. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as read. Motion was approved by voice vote.

#### **Opening Business:**

- Based on the results of the March 23, 2025 congregational meeting, Kathy passed around an updated list of officers and elders.
- Guest Scott Adolphson proposed St Matthew sponsor a hole at Peninsula Golf Course as a means of community visibility and advertising for the church. The golf course will make and erect the sponsorship sign. Scott offered to pay the fee, which will be good for one year. A motion was made and seconded to accept the proposal. Motion was approved by voice vote. Pastor Sonnenberg thanked Scott and commended this example of "out-of-the-box" thinking.

#### Treasurer's report (Kathy Smith):

Kathy passed out a profit and loss report; an income and expense comparison chart for first quarter 2024 and 2025; and quarterly budget and expenditure updates for each fund.

Kathy explained that PayPal and Venmo giving platforms have been linked to our Easy Tithe account.

#### Finance (Vacant):

Evangelism report (Carl Deverter): Carl and Janis are reviewing videos that could be used for the Clallam fair showings.

#### Stewardship report (Lynn Vernon):

New members will be welcomed after Easter. Lynn is planning for a welcome dinner.

Lynn is working to promote the Sunday Bible Class.

Greeting cards are being sent to members and guests as appropriate, such as get well, missing you, etc.

Lynn is working on Stewardship education materials for the Carillon.

#### Information Technology report (vacant): No report

#### Subcommittee Reports:

#### Preschool (Jan Edmunds):

We have two or possibly three students for next year's program, with a goal of ten total students.

This year's KidsFest was very successful, with the red bags being a big positive.

<u>Constitution Committee:</u> The draft constitution and bylaws are being reviewed by all pertinent parties. Additional time will be required for all to submit their comments and recommendations.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

Two four-seat choir chair sets have been sold, with two five-seat choir chair sets remaining. It was suggested to keep these in the little chapel, but will need to be affixed to the floor for safety. Thanks to Janice for selling the four-seat sets.

There are no updates at this time to the Pastor Trump missionary visit.

There was discussion if the expiration dates of council officer terms needs to be addressed. Issue was tabled for now.



#### St. Matthew Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes, April 10, 2025 (Follow-up actions are italicized)

#### **Unfinished Business:**

Plans are being made for the Easter egg hunt. Easter decorating will be on Saturday, April 19.

- We have been notified that the house at 127 E 14th Street, which adjoins our parking lot, will soon be coming up for sale. It has 4 bedrooms and 2 bathrooms, with an initial asking price of \$510,000. Acquisition of this property would be a potential opportunity for church expansion, but consensus was to not pursue at this time due to financial considerations.
- As a mission opportunity, Tim suggested a carpool roster be developed to help both members and visitors get to church. Pete suggested to first develop a list of persons who might benefit from a ride being offered. *Tim will write an announcement for the Carillon*.
- Tim opened a discussion on other ways we might assist people in the community as a means of sharing the love of Jesus. Tim would like a second person to join him as he meets with persons in need of help. There is a general sense of concern about adequate volunteer help as the church seeks greater community engagement. It was noted that generational differences and expectations may create some volunteerism misunderstandings or difficulties. Peggy suggested there are a number of community resources a person could be referred to, and Jan noted there are already a number of ongoing engagement activities that may not be visible to all. *Tim will write an announcement for the Carillon*, and further discussion was tabled for now.

**<u>Closing:</u>** Meeting adjourned at 7:48 pm, with closing prayer by Pastor.

## BUTTERFLIES COME BEFORE SOWING

What do butterflies have to do with sharing the Gospel? They are not in the Bible, are they? Well, yes and no. You won't find a butterfly specifically mentioned but butterflies in the sense of nerves and fear are all over the Bible.

The fear we experience when we share our faith does not come from God. Paul suffered much more than you or I ever will and yet he wrote in 2 Timothy 1:7-8: "God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline. So do not be ashamed to <u>testify about our Lord.</u>" So where does our fear of sharing our faith come from? Fear comes from the evil one. Just like the athlete or warrior who seeks an advantage by attempting to frighten his opponent, Satan is able to use butterflies and thoughts like these to silence the witness of many: "God can send someone else who is not as afraid;" or "If I am afraid, I might not be a good witness"; or "I will go later when I am not so afraid." Having some fear and doubt is normal but we trust in God to get us through it. We also need to bring our fears to God in prayer trusting Him to carry us through. One person at a time, witnessing on the streets, on the internet, on the phone or even door to door is what God is asking us to do. Are you willing to take the time to talk with those around you who are facing an eternity of being separated from our loving God? Pray for Him to bring these people to you and then when you hear the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" Answer with "Here am I. Send me!" Isaiah 6:8
